Advent Calendars

Advent as we know is the time when we prepare for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. One of the traditions we have is an Advent Calendar- which dates back to the mid-19th Century in Germany.

Today, most Advent Calendars include paper doors that open to reveal an image, with a quotation from scripture - or a piece of chocolate.

Reverse Advent Calendars

You may also have seen how a number of charitable organisations are promoting "Reverse Advent Calendars" to help the most vulnerable in our society by providing much needed items such as food or clothing at Christmas.

Reverse Advent Calendars work by, first of all, making your own calendar and then each day filling the space on your calendar with an item of food or clothing.

When complete, the calendar is taken complete with items, and donated to a charity who will then distribute the items to those most in need.

This week on BBC Scotland's "Thought for the Day", the speaker gave the idea of reverse advent his full support-although he disagreed with the word "reverse", because the sentiments of care, compassion and consideration for others are what ADVENT is all about. Which is what we are all about at Holy Cross High School.

SCOTTISH SPACE SCHOOL

The Scottish Space School web site is now live and fifth year pupils can apply via the web site for a place at the 2018 space school. To apply for the Scottish Space School, you must be in S5 in the current school session and be studying Maths and Science subjects at Higher level. Scottish Space School will run from Sunday 10 June until Friday 15 June 2018. Each year pupils from all over Scotland attend this residential course at Strathclyde University comprising of workshops and lectures all based on a space theme. The deadline for this year's applications is **21 January 2018**, and no applications will be accepted after this date. The top 10 students will then be selected for a 7-day learning journey to the Johnston Space Centre in Houston, Texas. Each School usually has two or three successful applicants to the Scottish Space School and if you are exceptional you might even make it to Houston. Good Luck
